A Message from the Executive Director

Hope and Healing through Connection

As the year draws to a close, so do the DHH celebrations around serving the community for 25 years. The celebrations were bitter sweet: sweet that we have been a sustainable organization over that time and grown to where we are today supporting approximately 600 clients plus their families: bitter in that the need is ever increasing for hospice care.

Unfortunately as we see our client numbers grow, we are also seeing a younger demographic accessing our services. The youngest client in the art therapy program is 3 years old and experiencing anticipatory grief, and our eldest client in the palliative program is 100 years old. Our average age, sadly, is 59 years old!

DHH staff has been busy this year participating in working groups through the Central Local Health Integrated Network, around hospice palliative care services in the region



and how to better serve our clients. Community/ visiting hospices play a crucial role in the continuum of care for an individual diagnosed with a life-threatening illness. The support offered is for newly-diagnosed clients going through surgeries, chemotherapy, radiation and hopefully on to the road to remission; but for others, it's about supporting someone working through their advanced care plans or helping them have difficult conversations with their families; it's about living until you die!

To be able to continue supporting our clients, we have to raise 80% of our annual budget which is proving to be more challenging than in the past. So, to that point, we held a few **fun**draising events. We kick started the year by drawing the inaugural NewRoads to Hope Chevrolet Cruze car raffle; what an amazing feeling, making someone's day by calling and saying "the winner is ... Dawn Kamino."

In May we laced up our training shoes for the annual Hike 4 Hospice, a lovely event which brought out clients, volunteers, families and community support, including the Lions Club Newmarket, preparing the BBQ lunch, & title sponsor, Torcan Waste Management. Following closely, was our Tee off for Hospice golf tournament, our signature event over the past few years. The fall offered us an opportunity to collaborate with three other charities, hosting the Dream Halloween gala, closely followed on its heels by the shop 'til you drop Craft and Gift Show. It's because of events like this that we are able to provide the programs and services we offer.

Visiting Volunteers help with day-today needs such as appointments, shopping and outings. Contact can be maintained through regular telephone calls. Clients are interviewed by our professional staff and matched with an appropriate volunteer.

Oasis Day Program

The Oasis Day Program provides a safe environment for social interaction and activities that illness can often restrict. Offered every Thursday and Friday at Doane House Hospice 10:00am-2:00pm. Lunch is provided.

Art Therapy

Offers a different approach to traditional talk therapy, using art to help children, adolescents, and adults express thoughts and emotions they may not know how to express otherwise.

Caregiver Support

This program is open to anyone caring for a loved one living with a lifethreatening illness. Trained volunteers facilitate this group once a week for one hour.

Bereavement Program

This program offers education and support for both family and friends coping with the loss or illness of a loved one. The program offers a variety of formats, including:

- Individual Support
- Group Support
- Family Support
- Walk and Talk

Volunteer Profile - Suzanne Henderson 2014 Recipient of the June Callwood Circle of Outstanding Volunteers

Suzanne Henderson is many things. She is the proud owner of a black lab named Ben. Likely, she and Ben enjoy regular walks around her Aurora neighbourhood. She practices yoga so I assume she is fairly flexible or becoming more-so. She belongs to a women's group and book club and I would wager that she is well-regarded by all. She's an avid reader, so to me that suggests she is imaginative and curious about the world.

She is also a dedicated volunteer. I know exactly what that means. She has a big heart.

Suzanne has been lending her generous time and efforts to Doane House Hospice for almost five years now.



As an Oasis group facilitator and visiting in-home volunteer, her contribution is largely on the front lines of client care. She has also been involved in the art therapy program and is an enthusiastic fundraiser.

In preparation for this profile, I spoke with Suzanne by phone. What I noticed right away was her humility and easy going nature. She described Doane House as a "nice place to be." She spoke of the sense of community and love she feels when she's at Oasis Program. "It's really comforting to be around people who are so caring," she tells me. Her warmth and sincerity is easily detectable even over the phone. It's interesting that she gets comfort from those she is there to

comfort. We often receive that which we give to others. Life is kind that way.

When asked what piqued her original interest in volunteering, Suzanne is thoughtful and confides that her motivation mostly came from a desire to "nurture others." Five years ago she was coming to the end of her tenure as her sister's nanny. She found herself without charges to care for and newly available hours to fill. Around this time she kept noticing a DHH ad in *The Month Ahead*. Soon after she stopped into the lovely old house on Yonge Street she had passed so many times over the years. The rest, as they say, is history.

Suzanne is in and out of Doane House many times a month and represents DHH when she visits homes directly. We are grateful, Suzanne, that you chose Doane House as a place where you could make a difference.

The professional art therapist encourages and motivates each individual to deal more effectively with the emotional, spiritual, and physical impact of grief on their lives.
