They have a beautiful butterfly garden themselves and raise monarch butterflies. Last year, they gifted us this garden and now maintain it.








A warm DHH WELCOME to KERRI LEIBOVITCH RN!

POLICIES and PROCEDURES provide framework for organizations, like Doane House Hospice. They define what DHH does and how we do it. Clear policies and procedures

support effective decision making and delegation because they provide guidelines about what staff and volunteers can and cannot do, what decisions can be made and what activities are appropriate. Having a clear policy framework means fewer misunderstandings or debates about what to do in particular situations. DHH Policies and Procedures ensure we realize our *Mission Statement* with transparency and consistency and make decisions as an accredited hospice within the HPCO.

DHH's Policy and Procedures are being updated. Volunteers can always find DHH Policy and Procedures by logging into the VOLUNTEER CAFE



Updating DHH Policies and Procedures is integral to our receiving FULL HPCO ACCREDITATION - a clear sign that DHH continues



to work at meeting national standards of quality and the provision of safe care.



HPCO Accreditation is an indicator of compliance with *Hospice* Palliative Care Ontario's Standards for Visiting Hospice Services (2014). Accreditation assures the delivery of consistent, high quality hospice palliative care among accredited programs and services located throughout the province. It notifies health professionals, the public and funders that an organization, institution or program is in

compliance with industry standards and has been recognized by HPCO based on a rigorous review of overall performance by industry peers. Accreditation also serves as an indicator of a VHS program's commitment to continuous learning and improvement. Working towards accreditation benefits our clients and DHH as a whole. Meeting recognized standards of excellence shows we are a culture of quality, safety, and client and family-centred care. For YOU, it is an indication of your dedication and the combined-pride and goals of all who work towards the support and services we offer to our community. Our accreditation achievements help to make DHH the sort of place in which it 'feels good' to give your time.



DHH was the first hospice in York Region to receive the (then) Hospice Association of Ontario (HAO), Level One (2006) and Level Two (2007) certified accreditation through the HAO's Visiting Home Hospice Volunteer Accreditation Program.

This year, HPCO has introduced a new level requiring evidence for Peer review. Submitting our application has meant a need to update our Bylaws. We will be voting these Board-proposed changes to the Bylaws at the AGM on Sept. 13th.
